Help For Parents and Professionals

By phone and in person, we help locate and obtain appropriate programs and services for children and youth with disabilities and other special needs. We:

- help identify the child's and family's needs
- provide accurate, up-to-date information
- provide guidance in selecting schools, programs and services
- act as educational advocates
- provide ongoing parent support

We follow through and follow up on all assistance given.

We provide help in English and Spanish. Call (212) 677-4650. We are open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. An answering machine will take messages after hours. All telephone help is free. Our *sliding scale waivable* fee for office consultation for parents is \$0 to \$50 and covers all help around a particular issue. We work with people of all income levels, all ethnic and racial groups, in all of New York City's boroughs.
